Bring the finest robe in the house and put it on him. Get a ring for his finger and sandals for his feet. And kill the calf we have been fattening. We must celebrate with a feast. . ."

What I love about our Heavenly Father is that when we start beating ourselves up, He interrupts us. "Stop!" the Father says. "Enough of that!" Like the father in this story, our Father gives us His best! The prodigal's father called for a celebration because his son who was lost had returned home. This is what the Christian life is supposed to be – a celebration! When you know God as Father, you can celebrate through life! Is there work to do? Are there challenges? Yes, but when you know God as your Father, you can celebrate in the midst of your challenges . . .your pain. . .and your circumstances.

My prayer for you is that as you draw close to God and truly know Him as Father, the fractures in your heart and soul that came from your upbringing or the struggles of life will be healed and made whole.
